

Appendix

The following pages are a list of all organisms that have been observed in Vistoso Trails Nature Preserve, uploaded to iNaturalist, and attained “Research-grade” status. The latter means that the community consensus is that the organism is of a particular species.

The lists are arranged alphabetically by scientific name within the broad categories of mammals, reptiles, amphibians, birds, invertebrates, plants, and fungi. Some of the organisms in the guide have not attained Research-grade status on iNaturalist and, as such, are not yet on these lists. This is generally because they have not been identified to the species level. This is especially true of the insects and the fungi.

The scientific name of each species listed here is hyperlinked (if viewing online) to a set of iNaturalist observations of that species within Vistoso Trails Nature Preserve.
